Council Projects

Dajarra Airstrip Access Road

Works have commenced to upgrade the access road to the Dajarra Airstrip. Crews are currently finalising the widening and shaping formation works in preparation for the sealing crew's arrival on 8 December. The project is forecast to be completed by 10 December (subject to any wet weather) and provide the residents of Dajarra with sealed access to their airstrip.





Equestrian Centre Irrigation Upgrade

Upgrades to the Equestrian Centre's irrigation are nearly finished. A new holding tank has been installed and trees have been planted, with the irrigation system expected to be completed before end of December.

Chinaman Creek Dam Master Plan

The initial concept plans have been released for public consultation. The response to date has been very positive with practical and productive suggestions received. Feedback is currently being collated and will be provided to Council's designers to review and incorporate into a revised design.
