CHINAMAN CREEK DAM – RECREATION AREA UPGRADE

Council have continued to progress the Chinaman Creek Dam Recreation Area Upgrade project with the final design to be completed in June 2022. In recent weeks, Council has purchased several key items that will form part of the upgraded recreation area, including new children's play area equipment, servery, new toilet amenities, BBQ's, picnic tables and benches. Project delivery has commenced with the acquisition of these long-lead items and project completion is scheduled for December 2022.

SIR HUDSON FYSH DRIVE UPGRADES

The upgrade works are progressing well and include the preparation of the improved road alignment, drainage, new car-parking at the front of the Lawn Cemetery and the new 2.5m wide shared pathway. Council would like to thank the community for their continued patience as the construction works progress along Hudson Fysh Drive through June and early July 2022.

PATH TO CHINAMAN CREEK DAM

Council would like to thank everyone for their patience as the Stage 1 construction works progress along Daintree Street. Once completed, the works will provide for a new 2.5m wide, 750m long off-road shared path from Sheaffe Street to Isley Street.

Stage 2 of the works are currently scheduled to commence and to be completed in the second half of 2022 and will provide for a further 3.25km of off-road shared path all the way to Chinaman Creek Dam Recreation Area with an additional 1km "loop" around the Lookout hill

Dog Registration

Is your dog registered? There are many benefits to having your pet registered with Council and it is a requirement that all dogs over 12 weeks old are registered, according to *Local Law 2 Animal Management* and *Subordinate Local Law 2 Animal Management* 2014.

Registration fees assist in providing key services and facilities that keep you and your pet safe when out and about in the community. These include:

- Lost and found service
- Facilities such as the pound
- Proof of ownership identification system
- Enables Council's Ranger to investigate and resolve dog attacks, barking dogs, wandering animal collection and reunification

Building Work Approvals

Did you know that most building work requires approval before building works begin? This is a requirement of State Government legislation. Unlawful building work has a number of consequences, such as issues with insurance, workers compensation claims, public liability and property sales.

Cloncurry Shire Council has become aware of instances where building work within the Shire has not been approved. All property owners are invited to contact Council to check whether building work on their property has been approved. Council's Planning and Environment team can provide information to assist with your past, present and future building application requirements.

The Planning and Environment team look forward to working with the community to ensure all structures within the Shire are compliant.
