As part of the 100-year celebrations, the families of the three founding fathers of QANTAS, Fysh, McMaster and McGinness, unveiled a monument on the bank of the Cloncurry River. The monument marks the place where McGinness and McMaster had their first chance meeting; a meeting that led to the beginning of QANTAS.

Celebrations continued with an afternoon tea at John Flynn Place and a gala dinner at the Shire Hall. The event was a huge success and I thank the McMaster, Fysh and McGinness families for celebrating in Cloncurry. Our community takes great pride in being an important part of the founding success of QANTAS.

The Chinaman Creek Dam Recreation Area is almost unrecognisable. The project has been tracking well and despite the recent rain, it is still on track to be re-opened to the community on 30 December 2022. Council appreciates the community's patience during this project.











CLONCURRY AIRPORT MASTER PLAN

Councillors awarded the tender to complete a Master Plan for the Cloncurry Airport at its October 2022 Council meeting. The aim of the master planning process is to build a clear picture of the airport's future, shaping short-, medium-, and long-term investment into this key regional asset. This will include planning for improved flood resilience, runway and apron design to accommodate larger planes and more flights, allowing opportunities for defence and defence industries, infrastructure to improve freight and logistics operations, airside fuel supply, lighting, drainage and so on. The plan is expected to be delivered by the end of July 2023.

PERKINS STREET HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

The Perkins Street Housing Development project is well underway. The civil component of the subdivision is nearing completion, with power recently installed and street lighting now operational. Council is finalising the housing Design and Construction tender process.

CURRY KIDS NEW EARLY LEARNING CENTRE

Cloncurry Shire Council has been working towards upgrading the Curry Kids Early Learning Centre to better service the growing demand for childcare places in Cloncurry and address a growing waitlist. Council is excited to announce that it has been awarded \$4,393,200 in grant funding from the State Government towards a new childcare facility.

The project is proudly funded by the Queensland Government's Resource Community Infrastructure Fund Round 2, in association with Cloncurry Shire Council. The Resources Community Infrastructure Fund is a voluntary partnership between the Queensland Government and the resources industry.

The grant funding, combined with a contribution from Council, will enable a new state-of-the-art childcare facility that will incorporate best practice design to future-proof the Shire's early childhood education offering.

Council has a concept design and new site location planned for the project. A detailed design of the project has already commenced.
