# **Council Projects**

Council is continuing to deliver its Priority Projects, along with upgrades to other key community projects, as per the 2021 - 2026 Corporate Plan. Below is a snippet of projects in progress and recently completed ones.

## **Projects in Progress**

### CHINAMAN CREEK DAM RECREATION AREA UPGRADE

Auzscot Constructions have been awarded the contract for the civil construction and installation of the key elements for this project. Construction commenced on 29 August 2022. In the interest of public safety, and to enable the contractors to complete the project in the shortest timeframe possible, Council



has closed the Chinaman Creek Dam Recreation Area to the public until 30 December 2022. An alternate access road is available, so the community can continue to access Chinaman Creek Dam during the project. Council recognises the inconvenience this may cause and would like to thank everyone for their patience during the construction phase of this project.

### PERKINS STREET HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

The Perkins Street Housing Development project is well underway. Whilst the civil component of the subdivision takes shape, Council has released a tender for the design and construction of the nine affordable, family-style homes. To facilitate the installation of infrastructure associated with the subdivision, a section of Perkins Street was required to be closed temporarily. Council would like to thank residents and businesses impacted by this road closure for their patience during this time.



### PATH TO CHINAMAN CREEK DAM

Construction of Stage 1 of the Path to Chinaman Creek Dam is now complete. A new a 2.5m wide shared pathway along part of Daintree Street was constructed during this stage. Stage 2 will add a further 4.4km of

Upgrade of the infrastructure at the Lawn Cemetery has been completed. The finished project included a new memorial wall, 3 gazebos, new entrance archway and gates, additional bench seating and rehabilitated internal roads and kerbing.



## Rates, Rates!

### HAVE YOU RECEIVED YOUR RATES NOTICE?

Cloncurry Shire Council would like to advise that the half-yearly rates notices are expected to start arriving in mailboxes from 30 August 2022. If you have not received your rates notice by Friday, 9 September 2022, please contact Council on 07 4742 4100 or council@cloncurry.qld.gov.au.

### ARE YOUR DETAILS UP TO DATE?

It is important to keep your contact details up to date with Council to ensure you receive your rates and water consumption notices. These notices are posted or emailed to the last known address registered with Council at the time of issue. It is the property owner's responsibility to notify Council in writing of any changed contact details. You can notify Council about changed contact details by completing the *Update Personal Details Form*, found on Council's website. Please complete the form and return to Council in-person at the Administration Office, via email, post or fax.

### WOULD YOU LIKE TO RECEIVE YOUR RATES NOTICE VIA EMAIL?

Council can send ratepayers their notices via email. If you would like to receive your notices via email in the future, please complete the *Update Personal Details Form* or send Council an email request. Council must receive your request in writing to be able to send notices via email.

### ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A PENSIONERS RATES REBATE?

You could be eligible for a rebate of 20% (to a maximum of \$200 per annum) of the gross rates and charges levied. At Council's discretion, a rebate may be granted to aged, widowed, invalid or other pensioners who are eligible to receive the State Government Pensioner Rate Subsidy. This rebate/concession compliments the subsidy that is offered under the State Government's Pensioner Rate Subsidy Scheme. Visit Council's website or speak to Council's Rates Officer to find out if you meet the eligibility criteria.

# Do not forget to register your pet!

### 50% DISCOUNT PERIOD ENDS 30 SEPTEMBER 2022

If you have a dog over 12 weeks old living in the Cloncurry township, it must be registered with Council. To register your dog, visit Council's website and complete the *Dog Registration Form*. Alternatively, you can visit Council's administration office and ask for a hard-copy of the form.

Dogs registered between 1 July 2022 - 30 September 2022 will receive a 50% discount off the standard fees.

Dog Registrations assist Council in providing key services aimed at keeping you and your dog safe when out and about in the community.
