<u>Kerbside Collection</u> <u>18 – 22 November 2024</u>

In preparation for the storm season, **Council is offering a free residential kerbside** collection. Collections will be between 7:00am and 2:00pm each day, commencing on Monday, 18 November 2024, through until Friday, 22 November 2024.

This service is being conducted in addition to the regular rubbish collection service and aims to assist residents with a pre-storm season tidy-up.

This kerbside collection applies to residents living in the Cloncurry designated town area.

The following rules apply to the hard waste collection service:

- The collection of vehicles can be arranged by appointment only. Contact Council to organise a collection on 07 4742 4100.
- All items (other than vehicles) should be a manageable size and weight for a twoperson lift.
- All loose and breakable items must be contained in boxes or bags.
- Council is not permitted to enter properties to collect items. All items must be placed in a safe place, on the kerbside.

Residents are advised to place all acceptable unwanted waste and green waste on the kerbside no more than 2 days prior to Monday, 18 November 2024. Council advises that it is the responsibility of the resident to ensure items are secured when placing them on the kerbside. Failure to do so may result in infringement.

Kerbside Collection 18 - 22 November 2024

WHAT WE WILL COLLECT	
White goods	Furniture items
Hot water systems	E-waste
Mattresses	Toys, bicycles and sporting goods
Sinks	Wood products up to 2 metres in length
Vegetation and green waste (clippings must be contained)	Tin and scrap iron up to 2 metres in length

WHAT WE WILL NOT COLLECT	
Dirt and stones	General household waste (i.e. food scraps) that would normally be placed in your wheelie bin
Bricks and concrete	Liquids, including paints and oils
Commercial waste	Hazardous waste (i.e. chemicals, oil, asbestos, explosives, ammunition)
Tyres	Gas bottles
Glass and mirrors	Fuel tins
Hot ash or material that is smouldering or aflame	Other items that may present a risk to safety
